DND to Hire Civilian Intelligence Analysts

In early Fall, the Public Service Commission (PSC) posted a job advertisement on its public website announcing that the Department of National Defence (DND) was looking to hire 12 civilian intelligence analysts. The competition, which was closed on 6 October, read as follows:

Ottawa, ON

CHALLENGE:

Develop and produce defense intelligence information on issues of a political and social nature, asymmetric threats, strategic military doctrine, military operations and capabilities, including weapons and sensor systems, and international arms treaties. Responsibilities will involve either a portfolio of foreign countries or assigned specific subject matter topics. EDUCATION:

Successful completion of a Master's degree at a recognized university with a specialization in political science, international relations, history or related discipline, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

EXPERIENCE:

Experience in researching analysing and synthesizing information on international security and defence issues.

Experience in providing strategic advice and analysis to decision-makers and senior management.

Experience in drafting and vetting a wide variety of written documents such as ssessments, analyses, briefing notes, and presentations.

Experience in preparing and conducting oral briefings.

New US National Counterintelligence Executive

On 24 July 2003, US President George W. Bush announced his intention to appoint Michelle Van Cleave, Special Assistant to the Under Secretary for Policy at the Department of Defense, National Counterintelligence Executive in his administration. According to the White House Press Release,

[b]efore joining the Department of Defense in 2001, [Van Cleave] served as President of National Security Concepts, Inc., a Washington, D.C. firm. During the 105th Congress, Ms. Van Cleave was Staff Director and Chief Counsel for the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Technology, Terrorism and Government Information. She earlier served at the White House in the Office of Science and Technology Policy, both as General Counsel and Assistant Director for National Security Affairs. Ms. Van Cleave holds a bachelor's and a master's degree from the University of Southern California, and a J.D. from the U.S.C. School of Law.

According to journalists Bill Gertz and Rowan Scarborough, "[t]he national counterintelligence executive is in charge of a new interagency office created to strengthen U.S. counterintelligence and counterespionage capabilities. The office is a central authority for counterintelligence assessments, damage assessments from spy cases and producing warnings of intelligence threats."
